



## Casting a spell

1/3/18

An idea I think may be possible with current technologies is a way for a custom, screen printed sigil to ignite into flames or sparks upon a vocal command.


The idea is that the sigil is printed in a combustible material. When the paper is placed on an "altar" (next page), and the vocal command is spoken, the altar emits an electrical signal that causes the combustible material to react, creating a very small fireworks show on the paper.

Another possible thought is that a custom "wand" is created that emits a bluetooth signal that ignites the paper upon vocal command.

Whichever avenue I end up taking; wand or altar, will very likely depend on what is possible, most practical, and most cost-effective/profitable.






I wonder if having "likes" or hearts may cheapen the experience of this project. At the same time, I would be nice to have a way of measuring fan favorites.

A thought → Could the sigil database item in shop item be one and the same?



## Validating Value Propositions

Brittany brought up some good points about doing early testing - way before the stage of setting up a storefront.

The first thought is to apply to markets. This would require having a cursory inventory to show off.

The next thought is product validation by going directly to vendors that boast selling local and seeing if they would sell any of the sigil products. This would give me instant feedback from several sources that would give me an idea of whether these products are viable or not.

This leads me to the thought/desire that I would very much like to get prototypes created. I'll start with notebooks/sketchbooks since I'll be meeting with Maya on Tuesday. Some talking points to go over:





Depending on the amount of combustion, I could attach interpretations to them.


Part of sigil burns - means X

# The Sigil reading

What if notebooks were printed with invisible salt peter ~~sigils~~ sigils on each page. People would be instructed to journal and then select pages for a reading. The selection should be based on a journal entry that is meaningful to them in some way.

The user could be instructed on how to perform their own reading, or could go to the storefront ~~the~~ have their reading performed.

The instructions could be a separate purchasable package with either a digital option or a piece of literature sent to the user.

These things could all be included in a "Starter Kit" that gives you all components for each step of the process.

At the very least, the website should exist as a place to find the meaning of each sigil. Perhaps that's a priority before trying to sell anything.

← This test has me thinking — how much time will it take for the saltpeter solution to dry? This timing may make creating the booklet rather time consuming.

Because I've decided to call the company Name the "Curious Markings Co.", I'm going to try to no longer call these signs, and instead "markings".








## Backgrounds

## Refining the marketing component

Last summer I spent about \$100 on advertising for Stridr on Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest. Altogether, the ads got about 10 click-throughs. This was over about a month.

Admittedly, my scheduling logic was way off, but the algorithm I wrote in 10 hours, after running for 4 hours, garnered over 200 click-throughs before I shut it off. During this time, Twitter automatically shut off my write access to their api.


## How to fix it:

There was a bit of a gap in this progress journal. I think Matt said to me one too many times, "Get to work!" So I did. The website is now live at [curiousmarkings.com](http://curiousmarkings.com) with over 50 registered users, the iPhone app has been approved by Apple and set for release on May 1st, and I'm taking a 4 day break with a trip to Victoria w/ Brittany.

I've built the minimum viable product, now it's time to get the word out there and measure the users' interaction with it.

A friend that I met through Minecraft, Luke Isaac, has expressed interest in contributing to the project with his Marketing and social media skills.

This development reminded me of a conversation I had with a Silicon Valley professional, Dan Ellis, about how I need a co-founder, someone who complements

my skills. Specifically, he mentioned an ideal match for me would be a 'growth hacker,' someone who can get the name out there and ~~get~~ people using and talking about the product.

While Luke is young, I believe he has a strong potential for being the growth hacker I'm looking for. That said, I don't think he understands that I am open to a partnership, rather than him being just an employee. I believe if he can generate a substantial amount of users, he is very much entitled to a large portion of the fruits of my past 4 months of labor.

That said, where he is in life is still quite uncertain, and I need to put myself in a position where I can't be left high and dry.

With or without Luke, however, now is the time to start looking at in detail what my next steps are.

The micron I've used to scribe all things CMC is reaching the end of its lifespan. I find it rather appropriate timing, given the launch of the website, and the completion of the iOS app.

I feel like I should be writing something profound and insightful with the last legs of this micron, but if there's anything I learned from Stride, it's not about some sort of finality with a project.

To me the nature of creating something isn't about completion. It's about pursuing an idea and continually assessing the economics of it. As long as it's either making me happy, making me money ~~or~~ or even better, both, it will continue as a growing entity. Eventually, it stops being worth it, and I move on.

Eventually, this micron will produce an unsatisfactory amount of ink, and I will move on to my backup. And when that happens, R.I.P., Micron!
